- 1. The goal of mastering the discipline (module) "Pediatrics" is to acquire knowledge about the main diseases of childhood, as well as the principles of diagnosis, treatment and prevention of childhood diseases. The objectives of the discipline are:
  - the acquisition by students of knowledge in pediatrics (about the main diseases of childhood);
  - teaching students the most important diagnostic methods to identify pathology in the early stages of development;
  - teaching students to recognize characteristic clinical symptoms when examining a patient, in determining the severity of the pathological process;
  - teaching students the ability to identify leading clinical signs, symptoms, syndromes, etc.;
  - teaching students the ability to identify leading clinical signs, symptoms, syndromes, etc.;
  - teaching students to choose the best laboratory and paraclinical examination methods for somatic and infectious diseases and to compile an algorithm for differential diagnosis;
  - training in the full scope of medical, rehabilitation and preventive measures among patients with various nosological forms of diseases;
  - teaching students to provide children with first aid in case of emergency;
  - teaching students to choose the optimal etiopathogenetic treatment regimens for the diseases most commonly encountered in children;
